David Roe

Retired, Law Offices of David Roe

David Roe was a Senior Attorney for the Environmental Defense Fund for 25 years, during which he drafted Proposition 65. He was educated at Yale, Oxford, and Yale Law School.

Tom Lewandowski

Dr. Lewandowski is a toxicologist and chemist working in Gradient's Seattle, Washington office. He has over 30 years of experience in the areas of product safety evaluation, pharmacokinetics, metals toxicology, and developmental toxicology. He has helped numerous clients respond to 60-day notices and avoid receiving such notices by understanding the likelihood that different materials in their products contain Prop65-listed chemicals. He has also developed Proposition 65 safe harbor limits and designed supply chain chemical testing programs. Tom is board certified as a toxicologist in both the US and Europe. He is an affiliate faculty member at the University of Washington School of Public Health where he lectures on toxicology and risk assessment. He is the author of numerous publications related to risk assessment methods (in particular the use of computer models).
